Badges cost 6 CHF and for each order there will be a charge of 10 CHF postage and handling. Feel free to adapt activities to be age appropriate. Note that where there is a **, you must reference the appendix at the end of the task list.

- 1 Using the History (LINK HERE) of Our Chalet on the Webpage, complete either A or B
 - a) Act out the opening day of Our Chalet
 - b) Complete this wordsearch of Our Chalet history **
- 2 Complete either A or B
 - a) Find a member of Guiding or Scouting who was a girl in the 1930s and invite them to visit you and tell you about being a girl guide/scout back then.
 - b) Find someone who has been a guest at Our Chalet or who has visited Switzerland and invite them to visit your unit or meeting place to share their experiences.
- 3 Complete both A and B
 - a) Learn and sing the Our Chalet Song.
 - b) Learn and sing the song Edelweiss. Find out what the flower looks like and where it grows.
- 4 Complete either A, B or C
 - a) Try Scherenschnitt a traditional Swiss Craft. **
 - b) Create and make your own cowbells. **
 - c) Design your own cable car. Create the ultimate cable car on paper or work together to build one using cardboard and craft supplies.

SCHERENSCHNITT

This Swiss Craft involves cutting a design out of a coloured paper, usually black, and then displaying it on a lighter coloured paper, usually white. By cutting out the outline and fine features of your design, the white then shows through in the background of your picture. Your design should all be cut out of one sheet.

MAKE YOUR OWN COWBELL

The sky's the limit for your imagination with this craft. Suggestions include using tin cans and a metal weight for the actual bell, and then paper and felt for the decoration and for the collar that the bell hangs from. Flowers, mountains, and patterns are all commonly used.
